Area of Study

Science, Social Studies, Careers, Vocational Courses, Applied Commerce Education Courses

Purpose of Trip

To allow students to engage in hands-on, interdisciplinary learning about agriculture that connects directly to the Manitoba curriculum, while exploring a variety of potential careers, and gaining a deeper understanding of the agriculture industry's importance and impact.

Goals and/or Student Learning Outcomes

Students and their chaperones will receive a career passport and a show floor map to guide their experience. By visiting booths and completing their

passports, they can win a prize. At each booth, employees from participating companies will answer questions and lead hands-on activities related to their fields. Throughout the experience, students will use social, communication, and basic navigation skills as they engage with industry professionals and explore the event space. This engaging opportunity allows students to discover different career areas, learn about opportunities within the agri-food industry, and be inspired by those who live these careers every day.



In Canada, 1 in 8 jobs in the workforce are in agriculture and agrifood. There are over 39,000 jobs and countless career paths in Manitoba's agriculture and agrifood industry.

Accessibility Needs

The following accessibility features are available in the Keystone Centre: automatic doors, ramps, elevators, wheelchair-accessible bathrooms, and water fountains. Service dogs are permitted.

What to Bring

AgVenture Scavenger Hunt

The AgVenture Scavenger Hunt gives students the opportunity to practice a range of skills connected to multiple Manitoba curriculum areas, from science to social studies. A key focus of this activity is career exploration, as students engage with professionals and learn about the wide variety of careers available in the agrifood sector. This portion of the day connects directly to all career education courses, vocational courses, Grade 10 Geography, and Grades 7–10 Science outcomes related to career exploration and real-world applications.
