Charting our Course to Agriculture Literacy in Manitoba

Finding the way to our North Star

To successfully chart a course, you must know where you've been, where you are, and where you want to go. You also need a map and a plan to get you there.

Imagine if every educator in Manitoba was agriculturally literate. Imagine if every student could experience one of our programs or learn using one of our accurate, balanced and current resources or activities. If you can imagine this, then you can see our North Star.

In 2019, AITC-M developed the Six Pillars of Agricultural Literacy, a map to our North Star. The Pillars will guide our program and resource offerings, help us measure our success, and coordinate our efforts with teachers and industry partners.

We established the Pillars as a framework to ensure our offerings will one day include, at every grade level, the relationship between:

- An agriculturally-literate citizen understands where his or her food comes from, and the important role agriculture plays in their everyday lives.





A Message from the President

Imagine a future where all Manitoba students leave high school with the knowledge and understanding to form opinions and make informed decisions about modern agriculture. As adults, they know where to look for accurate information when questions arise and can think critically about misinformed messages from the media. This is the North Star that Agriculture in the Classroom - Manitoba is traveling towards and it is with strong partnerships we can get there.

In 2019, AITC-M reached 37,968 students with programs and resources, but the demand for more remains beyond our capacity. 

Bingo & Word Searches

This summer AITC-M staff had a lot of fun developing new printable activities for teachers to download from our website.

Our word searches were created under four agriculture-related themes: animals, careers, equipment and crops. The free downloadable activities are easy for teachers to print and ready-to-use. The word searches have been a huge hit, being our top downloads for 4 months in a row! They were introduced in August of 2019 and were downloaded 278 times by the end of the year.

Road Trip Ag Bingo was developed at the start of summer and promoted to all Manitobans, not just teachers and students. We encouraged people to download the three different printable cards to take with them on their summer road trips. The cards featured various agriculture-related sights seen from Manitoba highways and in towns. We also ran a contest with Crampton's Market to help market the Bingo to people outside of our immediate followers. The Bingo cards were downloaded 251 times last summer.
